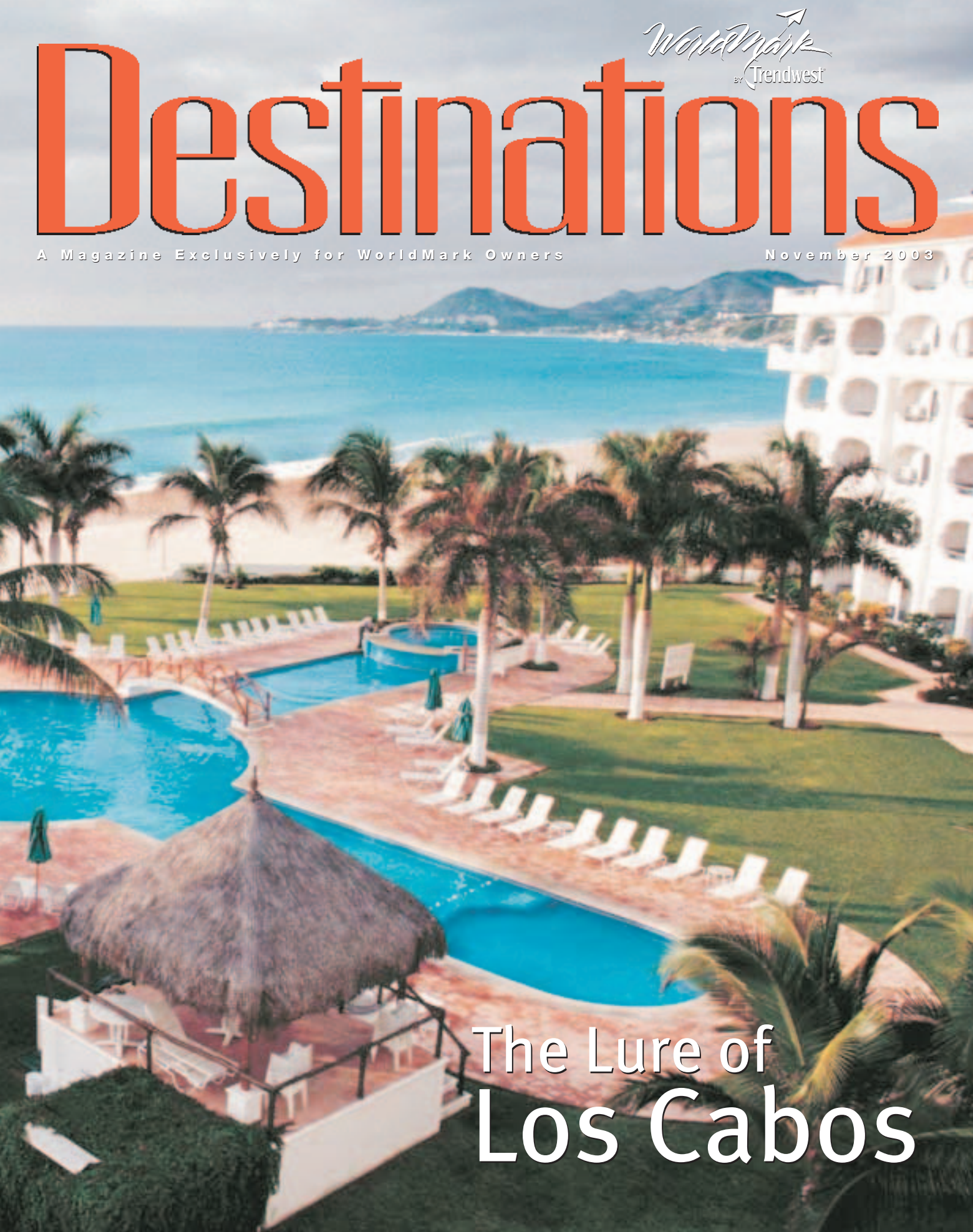

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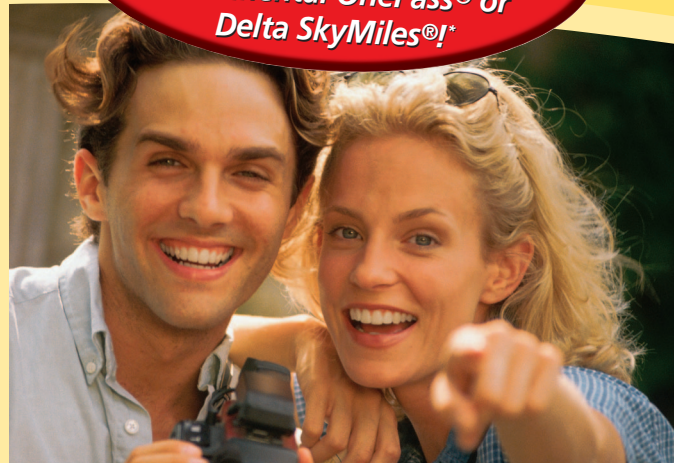

# Las Vegas New Year

Last year over 250,000 people celebrated New Year's Eve on the Las Vegas Strip. If you plan to ring in 2004 in the Diamond City, keep this valuable transportation information in mind:

- Las Vegas Metro Police close down the Strip (aka Las Vegas Boulevard) from north of the Stratosphere to south of Mandalay Bay and a mile each way east and west. Except for emergency vehicles, all road traffic (including taxis and buses) is excluded from that area from 6 p.m. on Dec. 31 until 6 a.m. on Jan. 1.
- While parking is normally free at Strip casinos, many close their parking lots on New Year's Eve to anyone who is not a registered guest. If open, casino lots may charge from \$20 to \$40 per car for the night. And if you park at these lots before 6 p.m., you will not be able to leave with your car until

the following day at 6 a.m.

- Citizens Area Transit (CAT), the Las Vegas public bus system, will be free for 24 hours, from 6 p.m. on Dec. 31 until 6 p.m. on Jan. 1. The buses will get you as close to the Strip as possible.
- The WorldMark Las Vegas on Spencer Street resort shuttle will stop running at 6 p.m. on Dec. 31 and start running at 10 a.m. on Jan. 1.
- The WorldMark Las Vegas resort shuttle will run its regular hours—10 a.m. to 1 a.m.—but will drop off and pick up owners at the public bus stop on Sunset Avenue.
- Please be aware that if you fly into Las Vegas on Dec. 31 with an arrival time around or after 6 p.m. and are staying at a Strip location within the closed-off area, taxis and shuttles will not be able to take you all the way to your hotel.

All Vacation Planning Center services—including online reservations and cancellations—will be closed over Thanksgiving weekend, November 27-30. This is to facilitate the move of Reservations and Trendwest Travel to their new offices. There will be no telephone or online services available during this time. We apologize for any inconvenience.

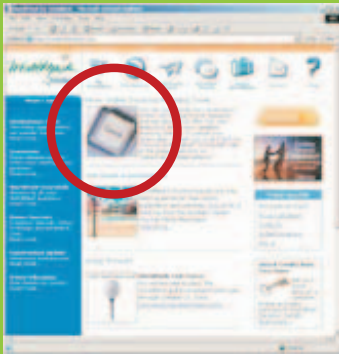

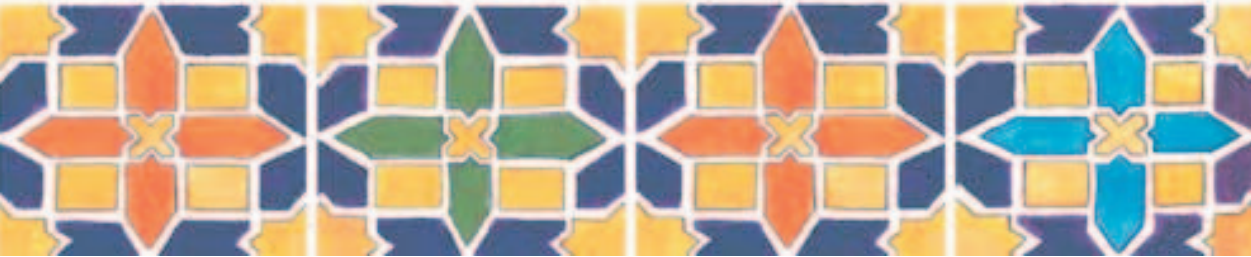

## *The path of least resistance*

For the most relaxed vacation possible, the course of (in)action is simply to never leave the grounds of **WorldMark Coral Baja**. Seriously.

Our beautiful resort is located approximately 10 miles southeast of the San José airport and two miles south of the city of San José del Cabo. The two main five-story buildings facing the beach meet at a gentle angle and resemble inviting arms that embrace the public area: Two spas, barbecue areas, an on-site restaurant and the striking, enormous cross-shaped pool with its swim-up bar. An additional building is located across the parking lot in back and has no ocean view, but those owners staying there are compensated with spas for their personal aquatic joy.

Even for money, food shopping or souvenirs, there's no need to go into town. The front desk exchanges cash and traveler's checks for pesos, and there is an ATM on the grounds. The company store on site sells food staples, snacks and bottled water as well as postcards, magazines and souvenirs; **Trader Dick's**, just outside the WorldMark entrance,

has a slightly bigger selection including some fruits and vegetables (**Trader Dick's** is scheduled to move a little further south of the resort in November 2003); and a liquor store on site sells libations. Souvenir vendors arrive right outside the roped-off beach boundary daily and will happily bargain with you for silver and turquoise jewelry, shawls and serapes, T-shirts and woven bags.

Feeling the urge to move a bit? The resort activities director leads stretching classes and water aerobics every day but Thursdays and Sundays. A volleyball net resides on the beach and another can be found at one end of the pool for water polo; a putting green, tennis court and shuffleboard court grace the premises as well. For the gym enthusiast, an exercise facility is located inside the company store and offers treadmills, stationary bikes, free weights and a universal machine. And if you've always wanted to sit atop a galloping horse and feel the wind in your hair, horseback rides are available from the vendor who appears daily with several horses and two canine companions. Reward yourself after these activities with a visit to on-site **Spa Arriba**, which can pamper you with everything from a manicure to a deep-tissue massage.

When hunger strikes and you don't feel like messing up the kitchen, stroll a few yards to **Mama Mia's Restaurant**, which is open from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. daily and presents a Mexican Fiesta on Tuesday nights and a beach barbecue every Friday, both with great musical entertainment. Just outside the WorldMark entrance are two American buddies—**Subway** and **Domino's Pizza**—for eat-in or take-out treats, along with the **Sardina Cantina**, which offers

breakfast, lunch and dinner in a cozy, sports-bar setting.

You can even learn a little something if you're so inclined: Scuba diving basics are taught at the resort Mondays and Fridays, Spanish language on Tuesdays and Fridays and bartending lessons are held every Saturday afternoon. Expand your horizons along with your waistline!



### *The road to wherever you want*

If you're curious about the world beyond WorldMark Coral Baja, you'll want to rent a car and explore. **San José del Cabo** is your stop if you're longing for authentic Mexican atmosphere. The city is located just two miles north of our resort: A brief drive along Highway 1 aka the Corridor—the four-lane paved major arterial connecting San José del Cabo to Cabo San Lucas—detours to the hotel district along the Paseo San José. Turn left onto Boulevard Mijares to go straight into the heart of San José del Cabo.

This is the Mexico you imagined, brimming with low, pastel-colored buildings studded with beautiful ornamental tile work and topped with terracotta roofs. An open, landscaped mall with stone arches, a gazebo and

fountain dominates the city center. Directly across the street from this plaza is **San José Church**, which can trace its roots to a mission built by Spanish Jesuits in 1730. One block south of the plaza is the Palacio Municipal, which was, on our visit, still bedecked with green, white and red bunting from the September 15 celebration of Mexican Independence Day. Shops, restaurants and crafts booths line the charming streets and present many choices for shopping and dining. We opted for the open-air café in front of the popular Tropicana which combines an inn with a bar and grill.

If you crave the recognizable with just a slight Mexican tang, head 18 miles south from WorldMark Coral Baja along the Corridor into **Cabo San Lucas**. Once a rustic outpost centered around its active marina and catering to sport fishing, Cabo San Lucas now seems to burst with luxury hotels, timeshare resorts, popular bars and restaurants and a raucous party atmosphere. It is a mecca for students during spring break season, and the “Dude!” ambiance persists throughout the entire year. Here you'll find happy-hour hangouts such as **El Squid Roe**, **The Giggling Marlin**, **Latitude 22+** and the **Cabo Wabo Cantina**, which is owned by Sammy Hagar, once of rock group Van Halen. If you crave a mall fix, the enormous **Puerto Paraiso**—accessible from the marina side or from Cárdenas, the major boulevard—presents local designers and eateries along with American familiars such as **Ruth's Chris Steak House**, **Houlihan's**, **Johnny Rockets**, **Guess** and **Sanrio**, makers of the “Hello Kitty” merchandise. For a more native retail experience, stroll along the promenade edging the marina to meet with countless vendors of beads, silver jewelry, bags and shawls; then seize the opportunity to have your picture taken with a four-foot iguana sitting on your head.

## Know Before You Go

**TRAVEL:** Trendwest Travel at 1-800-953-5511 is your best source for lowest rates on airfare, car rentals and transportation to and from the airport in Cabo.

**DOCUMENTS:** A passport is preferable for identification purposes; otherwise you'll need two forms of photo ID. An American Tourist Permit will be issued on your flight to Mexico—keep this with you at all times.

**CAR RENTAL:** You are required by law to buy Mexican auto insurance when you pick up your rental. Keep in mind that speed limits and lane divisions are very loosely adhered to, and driving at night is not recommended.

**WATER:** The water at WorldMark Coral Baja is purified, but has a high degree of sodium in it. If you have high blood pressure, bottled water is advised.

For an outing into the country, head north from Cabo San Lucas to Mex.19 for the 47-mile drive to **Todos Santos**. Fields of cactus and shrubby pines as well as ranches hosting grazing cows and horses line the two-lane road that yields to a magnificent view of the Pacific Ocean on your left. The baked coastal landscape slowly evolves into a greener setting of palms, avocado and mango, and you know you've arrived at Todos Santos, an artists' colony formed by Cabo San Lucas expatriates who had tired of the commercialization of that city. You can browse for hours in the galleries, studios, shops and cafes, and lose yourself in **El Tecolote Libros**, a tiny but exceptional bookstore. Culinary arts are also well represented; **Café Santa Fe** has a three-star reputation, but as children of rock n' roll, Steven and I headed for the **Hotel California**, immortalized by the Eagles in one of their signature songs. The intriguing décor of the hotel and restaurant includes wood salvaged from a shipwrecked Norwegian vessel, and tropical plants, wrought iron and vibrant tile work lend an air of exotic mystery. We lingered in the courtyard and savored an excellent lamb and three-cheese quesadilla while observing a woman channeling Frida Kahlo in dress and hairstyle go through several personality changes while talking to the staff—a truly bohemian moment.

### *Weather or not*

Although Hurricane Marty left a calling card of challenging road conditions and unpredictable electrical service, Steven and I were still able to sample the unique and varied charms of Los Cabos. The best were the simplest: The brilliance of the stars at night once the skies cleared, the multitudes of yellow butterflies dancing along the post-storm wind currents, and the sight of smiling WorldMark owners blissed-out in the spas, eyes closed, plastic margarita cup in hand. After all, vacation is really a state of mind.

So what happens when a hurricane—or other act of nature—decides to become part of your vacation itinerary? Although rare, tropical storms do occur at our exotic locations in Los Cabos, Hawaii and Fiji. Here's what to expect and what you can plan for.

### Resort reservations

- If you cannot get to your resort destination because an airport is closed, you will not be charged any credits for the nights you are not occupying your unit.
- If you cannot leave your resort destination because an airport is closed, you will not be charged any credits for the additional nights you must stay in your unit.
- Keep in mind that as soon as the airport re-opens, new owners will be coming in expecting their units to be ready, so you should make arrangements to leave as soon as the airport and your airline are operational.

### Travel

- Trendwest Travel must adhere to whatever policy each individual airline adopts to address a specific weather event. Most airlines do not waive change fees until the event has occurred, even if it is anticipated. After the event, airlines typically will allow rescheduling of flights within a specified

timeframe with no fees. Trendwest Travel can assist you with rescheduling your flights *before* your travel has commenced.

- If you are unable to leave your destination because the airport is

closed, contact the local airline office. Trendwest Travel cannot rebook your flight for you at this point, so ask your resort staff for assistance in contacting the airlines locally.

## Los Cabos amenities

- Restaurants and shops in both San José del Cabo and Cabo San Lucas open or close after a hurricane depending on whether or not they have a generator or can function without power. Smaller stores tend to be open, particularly those with non-perishable inventory.
- Don't expect to use your credit card while the power is out. After a hurricane, even if a store has a generator, many merchants seize the opportunity to operate on a cash-only basis.
- Most banks remain closed and ATMs are not operational for a few days after a hurricane, so keep an eye on your cash reserves.
- Street vendors offer deep discounts to make up for less foot traffic in their territories during the bad weather: After Marty, silver bracelets that were \$1 USD apiece the day before dropped to two for a dollar.

The best thing to do when the weather goes bad and the power goes off is to let go of your pre-conceived notions as best you can and try to find the good in the unexpected. The noise and distraction of televisions, VCRs and radios are gone; the pressure is off to look good, take stunning vacation pictures or cook; all you can do is ride it out and enjoy yourself. The morning after Hurricane Marty, one owner told me that he had gone outside during the height of the storm and sat in the spa, just so he could experience the elements first-hand. "It was the coolest thing I've ever done!" he happily exclaimed. In terms of personal safety, I can't commend his behavior, but I give him credit for finding his own silver lining in the clouds.
