On the Way to Bass Lake

This section includes points of interest and side trips along the way to the resort. For the most direct route, see "Driving Directions" below.

From San Francisco, CA

Drive south on Hwy 99, then continue on Hwy 145 east ...

"Madera County and Its People" is played out in **Madera County's Historic Courthouse**. Each of the 22 rooms is devoted to a particular aspect of Madera County and its growth. Free tours are available every weekend from 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

From Los Angeles, CA

Go north on Hwy 41 to Fresno, then east on O'Neals Road to North Fork...

The **Sierra Mono Museum** on Road 200 houses one of the finest collections of Native American basketwork and artifacts anywhere.

As you continue from North Fork on Road 225...

Find the exact center of California by taking Road 225 approximately five miles from North Fork. Turn right on Redinger Lake Road and drive about three miles. Just past the cattle guard in the road, you'll find the marker.

From Oakhurst, CA

Fresno Flats Historical Park is a recreated town where you can take a giant step back into the last century. The park is open for self-guided tours from dawn to dusk, and guided tours are available Wednesday through Sunday, March through December.

The **Southern Yosemite Visitors Bureau** operates a visitors information center at 41691 Hwy 41. Knowledgeable volunteers serve as hosts, offering a large variety of information on things to do and see in Madera County and Yosemite. Call them at (559) 683-INFO.

The **Sierra Vista National Scenic Byway** (June to October) meanders through the Sierra National Forest and has been dubbed the "Hidden Heart of the Sierra." There are many interesting and scenic points along the route. For a brochure, contact the Southern Yosemite Visitors Bureau at (209) 683-INFO.

Continuing north on Hwy 41...

The **Mariposa Grove of Giant Sequoias**, on the southern edge of Yosemite National Park, contains some 250 awe-inspiring giants, the largest trees in the world. A short walk or shuttle-bus ride takes you to the "Grizzly Giant." With a circumference

of more than 100 feet and a diameter of almost 35 feet, it is the oldest known Giant Sequoia, dating back 2,800 years.

Tunnel View, one of the most famous and photographed vistas in the world, provides the classic view of Yosemite Valley, including **El Capitan, Half Dome, Sentinel Rock, Cathedral Rocks** and **Bridalveil Fall**. As you exit the eastern end of the Wawona Tunnel, be prepared to pull into the parking area to your immediate left. There are also many things to see and do in **Yosemite National Park**. Call (209) 372-0200 for up-to-date recorded information.

From Placerville, CA

Go south on Hwy 49 toward Ahwahnee...

In addition to the great shops and eateries in **Mariposa**, visit the **California State Mining and Mineral Museum**, the **Mariposa County Museum and History Center** and the **Mariposa Courthouse**.

In **Ahwahnee**, the **Wassama State Historical Park** features an authentic ceremonial roundhouse. The spacious, oak-shaded park grounds include a picnic area, old Native American grinding stones and other artifacts.

Driving Directions

From San Francisco, CA

- Take I-580 to I-205 to I-5 North, then 120 East to Hwy 99 South.
- Stay on Hwy 99 South to Merced and then take Hwy 140 East to Mariposa.
- At Mariposa, take a hard right turn onto Hwy 49 South and continue to Oakhurst.
- Turn left on Hwy 41 North.
- Continue 2 1/2 miles from the town of Oakhurst on 41 North to Road 222/Bass Lake exit.
- Turn right onto Road 222. In 3.4 miles, turn right at the Bass Lake sign to continue on Road 222.

- From this point, it is 1/2 mile to the next intersection. At the fork, stay to the left—you will now be on Road 432. Drive 300 yards to the **WorldMark Bass Lake entrance on your right**. The check-in office is in the first building on the right.

From Los Angeles, CA

- Take Hwy 99 North to Fresno.
- At Fresno, take the Hwy 41 North/Yosemite exit through Fresno and then proceed 30 miles to Oakhurst.
- Follow bold directions to the left.
