On the Way to Discovery Bay

This section includes points of interest and side trips along the way to the resort. For the most direct route, see "Driving Directions" below.

From Vancouver, B.C.

Cross the U.S. border and continue south on I-5 ...

Bellingham is the hub of Northwest Washington. Shopping includes the massive **Bellis Fair Mall**. Visit the **1892 Whatcom County History and Art Museum** overlooking Bellingham Bay. Within easy walking distance is the **Maritime Heritage Center Park and Fish Hatchery**. For information, call (800) 487-2032.

Continue south on I-5 and take Hwy 20 West to Whidbey Island. Drive south on Whidbey, following signs to the Keystone Ferry. Take this ferry across to Port Townsend ...

Walk onto **Deception Pass Bridge** (if you dare). Here you can see the San Juan Islands and the turbulent waters of Deception Pass. Continue south to Coupeville and the **Island County Historical Museum**, with its focus on sea captains who traveled on Puget

Sound. Many buildings have plaques indicating the year they were built. It is on these shores that Whidbey's first settlements were built in 1883.

From Portland, OR

Go north on I-5 ...

Centralia's history is kept alive through historic landmarks, restored homes and its vintage marketplace. More than 130 antique shops and a number of outlet centers attract bargain hunters.

Look back at Washington's early years of statehood at the **State Capital Museum** in Olympia. Close by is the **Capital Campus, Vietnam Memorial Wall and Capitol Building**. Tours are held at regular intervals. In Tacoma, stop by the **Point Defiance Zoo and Aquarium**.

Continue north on Interstate 5 to Seattle (or take Highway 16 toward Bremerton)...

Take a tour of the Seattle waterfront. Ride to the top of the **Space Needle** or browse the shops in the historic **Pike Place Market**.

Take the Bainbridge Island Ferry, then proceed on Hwy 305...

Known as "Little Norway," **Poulsbo** was established by Norwegian immigrants in 1883. Enjoy authentic baked goods and quaint shops in this remodeled town.

Take Hwy 3 North and take Hwy 104 West across the Hood Canal Floating Bridge to Hwy 101 North, continue to Hwy 20, then north to Port Townsend ...

At the northeast tip of **Port Townsend** is **Fort Worden State Park** and the **Marine Science Center**. Visit the **Coast Artillery Museum**, and its display of Coast Artillery uniforms from 1880 to 1950.

Travel south on Hwy 20 back to US 101, then US on 101...

Follow the southern edge of Discovery Bay, named after Captain George Vancouver's ship *Discovery*, past your resort to Sequim. **Dungeness Spit**—a natural sandbar that juts into the water where the Strait of Juan de Fuca flows into Puget Sound. This sandbar is the longest natural sand promontory in the U.S.

Driving Directions

Please note: Port Townsend is not on your way to Discovery Bay unless arriving via the Keystone ferry.

From Seattle:

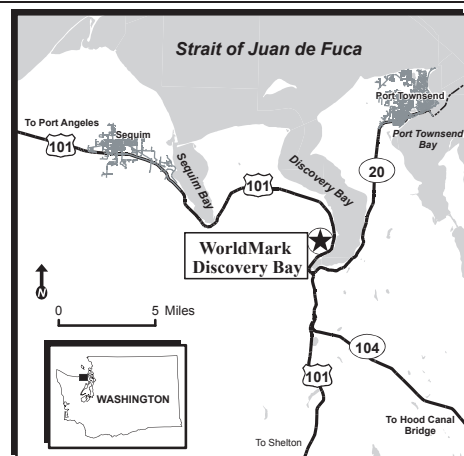
- Take the Bainbridge Island Ferry from the Seattle waterfront.
- Once on Bainbridge, proceed straight ahead on Hwy 305, take Hwy 3 North, and follow signs to the Hood Canal Bridge.
- Drive west on Hwy 104 across the bridge (do not exit onto Hwy 19 or 20).
- Proceed for 18 miles, then merge onto US 101. Proceed on 101 past the Discovery Bay Grocery approx. 1.5 miles to the WorldMark by Trendwest sign on your right.
- Turn right on Orcas Rd and follow signs to the Discovery Bay Condominiums.
- Once you reach the resort, the WorldMark office is in the first building to your left.

From Tacoma:

- Take Hwy 16 across the Tacoma Narrows Bridge. Continue on Hwy 16 north to Hwy 3.
- Take Hwy 3 North to the Hood Canal Bridge.
- Follow the bold directions to the left.

From Victoria, BC:

- Take the Coho Ferry from Victoria to Port Angeles.
- Exit ferry terminal right onto E. Railroad Ave.
- Turn left onto Laurel.
- Turn left onto E. 1st St (turns into US 101).
- Travel approximately 32 miles on US 101.
- Turn left on Orcas Rd and follow signs to the Discovery Bay Condominiums.



From Bellingham (Keystone/Port Townsend ferry):

- Take I-5 South to the Anacortes exit.
- Follow Hwy 20 to Whidbey Island and through the town of Oak Harbor to the Keystone Ferry.
- In Port Townsend, turn left on Water St (Hwy 20).
- Take Hwy 20 to US 101 (do not veer left onto Hwy 19) and follow signs toward Sequim and Port Angeles
- Follow the underlined directions to the left.
