Special Needs Unit Features

- All doors have at least 31” of clearance
- All doors have lever handles
- Tub/shower with fold down bench
- 22” to 29” high beds
- 18” high toilets
- Grab bars
- Accessible decks
- Roll-under lavatories
- Dining room table knee clearance 26”
- Front control kitchen appliances

Eagle Crest is wheelchair accessible throughout the main lodge, with Elevator access to the lobby and special needs units. Restaurants, health spas and most resort facilities are designed to accommodate wheelchairs. Golf courses are primarily level, with paved walkways and gentle slopes. The Eagle Ridge Sports Center has a lift available to assist mobility-impaired guests into and out of both the indoor pool and outdoor spa.

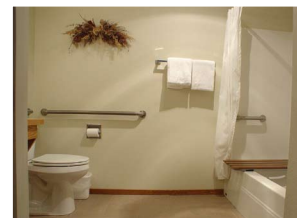

All special needs units feature card key lock entry, lever door handles and level thresholds. All doorways have at least 32” of clearance. Bathrooms are equipped with grab bars, 18” high toilets and lavatories with 28” of knee clearance. Standard tubs/showers have fold-down seats, hand-held shower heads and grab bars. Bedrooms have an accessible route to at least one side of the bed. Kitchens have front control ovens/ranges and dining room table knee clearances are at least 26” except in the one-bedroom unit which has a 36” bar without knee clearance.

Though two-bedroom suites and condos with Jacuzzis are not specifically designed for disabled access, these units represent the best alternatives. All have level entrances, card key locks and lever entry handles. Interior door widths in the suites are at least 29”, and in the condos they are 25”.
