## Reminders

- Remember, when contacting the resort, Fiji is 19 hours ahead of U.S. Pacific Time.
- To enter Fiji, you need a ticket for your departure and a passport valid for six months beyond your intended stay. Visas are unnecessary for stays under four months.
- Bring your own towels for the beach and island trips. (Pool towels are provided for use at the resort.)
- Vaccinations are not required unless you

have recently been in an area with cholera or yellow fever. Freshwater is safe to drink in the main towns.

- Electrical current is 240 volts, AC50 hz, with three pin/uni outlets. Bring converters and adapters for personal appliances. Units are equipped with hair dryers.
- Local calls are \$1.00FIJI

Units are assigned the afternoon of check-in by reservation number. This means you will be assigned the best *available* unit on the day you arrive, based on how far in advance you booked your reservation.

# Things to See and Do in Fiji

At last, paradise South Pacific style! Fiji is renowned for its tropical charm and the wide array of activities it offers visitors. Viti Levu, Fiji's main island, is home to your WorldMark resort and is the nation's center for the seemingly endless tourist activities available here.

With hundreds of sandy islands and warm, clear water, this island country has the stuff divers' dreams are made of. Snorkelers, too, will find plenty to gawk at in Fiji's teeming lagoons. There are complex **reef ecosystems**, such as the **Rainbow** and **Astrolabe**, known for their brilliantly colored soft corals and biological diversity. Fiji's waters boast more than 35 varieties of butterfly and angelfish alone and it's not unusual for divers to spy turtles, dolphins, manta rays, barracudas and sharks.

**Kayak expeditions** give you an intimate look at the islands, lagoons, people and indigenous wildlife of Fiji. Trips range from half-day to 10 days, and highlights include visits to Fijian villages, bird watching, lunching on isolated beaches, and hiking and snorkeling stops. Kayak tours and rentals are readily available from a number of operators during the dry season.

If you enjoy hitting the links, don't miss your chance to swing away under Fiji's blue skies. Viti Levu offers four of Fiji's five 18-hole courses, with two right in the Nadi area. Next door to your resort is the **Denarau Golf and Racquet Club**. Next to the Nadi International Airport is the **Nadi Airport Golf Club**, with its par-70, 5,882-

yard course. There is also the **Fiji Golf Club** in Suva and the **Pacific Harbour Golf Club** designed by Robert Trent Jones, Jr. Plus the islands offer a number of nine-hole courses.

You can charter just about anything here. Adrenaline-raising **jetboat rides**, leisurely **island-hopping cruises**, **game-fishing excursions** and dreamy **dinner cruises**. A day-trip could put you aboard a 100-foot schooner bound for the **Mamanuca Islands**. Other day-trips transport you to **Beachcomber Island** or **Aqualand**, natural sea-and-sand playgrounds where the day is devoted to water sports and revelry. Of course with as many nearby isolated, gem-like islands as Fiji has, a day-trip might not be enough. There are also overnight cruises to remote and exclusive destinations, like the legendary **Sawa-i-lau limestone caves**, the towering spires of the **Southern Yasawas** and the **Sacred Island of Vanua levu**. There are three-, four- and seven-night cruises that leave from Denarau Marina.

The lush diversity of Fiji's underwater flora and fauna is echoed inland as well. The **Garden of the Sleeping Giant** leads you through a flowering valley of tropical beauty. Fiji's largest collection of orchids, as well as other flowering gardens, lily ponds and a cool tropical jungle offer a vibrant and colorful way to enjoy the islands' botanic wonders.

Tropical clothing, carved war clubs, woven mats and baskets, face masks, shell jewelry, spears, *kava* bowls and *tapa* cloth

can all be purchased in town markets and also in local villages. Handicraft shops in **Nadi Town** on the **Coral Coast** and other tourist centers in Suva provide interesting experiences for both shopping and people-watching. Colorful hand-screened, hand-blocked and hand-dyed fabrics are also available and are very popular for making dresses and wraparound skirts.

During your visit, it's entirely possible that you will be invited to join villagers for a meal or **yaqona** (*yang-gona*) **ceremony**. This slightly narcotic beverage is served during all significant occasions, and you'll find more yaqona shops in Fiji than bars!

The islands here may be small, but they are exquisite and plentiful. Take your time and explore Fiji in all her splendor—on the land, on the water or in the water. The lush landscape, tropical climate and charming locals will make it hard for you to leave.

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## Driving Directions

### Airport Transfers:

You can pick up a taxi at the airport to take you to the resort.

Although we do not recommend that you drive in Fiji, you should know that vehicles travel on the left-hand side of the road. An international driving license is not required.
