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Special Needs Unit Features

- All doors have at least 33" of clearance
- All doors have lever handles
- Tub/shower with fold-down bath bench
- A portable bath bench with back support is available

Bear Lake offers handicap parking, a lowered section at the check-in counter for disabled access and an accessible route to the indoor pool and spa in a level to gently sloping setting.

Special Needs Units

Two bedroom, two bathroom

All special needs units feature card key lock entry, lever door handles and level thresholds. All doorways have at least 33" of clearance. Spacious bathrooms are equipped with grab bars, 17" high toilets and 26" knee clearance under lavatories. Standard tub/showers have hand-held shower heads, grab bars and fold-down bath benches. A portable bath bench with back support is also available. Master bedrooms are roomy, with ample access on both sides of the king-size bed. The kitchens sport sinks with 26" of knee clearance and front control appliances. Living areas are very open, and the 7'x14' patio even has a table with 27" of knee clearance. So much attention has been invested in accessible features that even the washers and dryers are front loading models.

Though not specifically designed for special needs, the ground floor one- and three-bedroom units boast accessible entrances, 33" doorways and floor plans similar to the special needs two-bedroom units. Bathrooms are a little smaller, have 16" high toilets and lack grab bars and hand-held shower heads.
