# Things to See and Do on Maui

Maui offers much more than the spectacular sunsets and whitesand beaches that first meet the eye. The island has many historical sites that remain well-kept secrets. Visit the Hale Kohola Whale Museum at Whalers Village to learn about whales and Lahaina's whaling history. Exhibits here range from the skeleton of a sperm whale to an authentic, fully outfitted whale boat. The *Carthaginian II*, a 93foot brig docked in Lahaina Harbor, is also a colorful maritime museum.

Journey into Haleakala National Park and Haleakala Crater, an area that has been carefully preserved. With its cool, cone-studded reminder of a once-active volcano, the park mystifies the traveler with cascading streams and quiet pools, silver plants and slashing scarlet birds. Cross Haleakala's lunar landscape on a hiking tour or via horseback with local guides and discover why it is called the "House of the Sun."

Ride the 1890s-vintage Lahaina-Kaanapali & Pacific Railroad "Sugarcane Train," which once shuttled sugar between Kaanapali and Lahaina. Celebrate the spirit of aloha in traditional Hawaiian style at an Old Lahaina Luau. As the sun sets, a Hawaiian feast, music and dancing begin on the beach of historic Lahaina. Another popular attraction is Iao Needle, which inspired Mark Twain to dub the picturesque Iao Valley "the Yosemite of the Pacific." Venture into Upcountry Maui, with its ranches and farms featuring spectacular views.

Tour the Tedeschi Vineyards and Winery for a taste of Hawaiian wine country. Or visit creatures of nature at the Keiki Zoo. You haven't truly been to Maui until you immerse yourself in the island's beautiful waters. With all of Maui's marine life, even beginning snorkelers and scuba divers will feel like Jacques Cousteau.

Kapalua is 22-miles away from 23,000-acre Maui Tropical Pineapple Plantation. This peaceful, secluded location is a wonderful place to get your fill of delicious pineapple, and then you can take some home. You are also given the opportunity to tour the working plantation. Visit Makena, famous for its remote beaches, where the white sand stretches for miles.

For an intimate look at the underwater world, you won't want to miss the **Maui Ocean Center**. Come face to face with some of Hawaii's most spectacular animals, and afterward, enjoy food, interactive displays and a gift shop at this aquarium.

One-day excursions to the nearby islands of Lanai and Molokai are a must. Maui is the only island that offers you access to these islands by boat. Take advantage of Trilogy Catamarans' day or overnight trips. During the morning ride to the islands, you will be treated to homemade cinnamon rolls; in the evening, there is a delicious barbecue. But the real treats, of course, are the islands themselves. Lanai is buried in mist-shrouded forests, white-sand beaches and perfect solitude. Molokai has many quaint villages, a country atmosphere and soaring sea cliffs. Many visitors delight in the mule ride down to Kalaupapa Peninsula.

Back on Maui, be sure to take a swing at some of the island's worldrenowned **golf courses**. Whether you're a beginner or a real pro, beautiful birds, glorious greens, towering palms, tropical flowers and panoramic views of the blue Pacific will create the perfect golf setting. Aloha!

# Driving Directions

# From Kahului Airport

- Depart the airport on Keolani Pl and continue straight through the traffic light onto Dairy Rd/Hwy 380.
- Turn left onto Puunene Hwy (at the traffic light and the First Assembly of God Church).
- Turn right onto Mokulele Hwy/ Hwy 311.
- Stay in the left lane and take Piilani Hwy/Hwy 31 (at the traffic light).
- About 5 miles ahead, turn right onto Alanui Ke Alii and continue toward the ocean. The resort will be on your right.

# **Alternate Route**

Rather than taking Hwy 31, this route gives you the opportunity to drive through Kihei and eat or shop before you check in.

- Follow the directions in **bold** to the left.
- On Hwy 311, go straight through the intersection with Piilani Hwy and continue to South Kihei Rd.
- Turn left here and continue through town. The resort is on the south end of town on the left.
