Kona is located on level to gently sloping property and has a registration desk that has a section with a 30" high counter. All resort accommodations have roll-in or elevator access, and there are handicapped parking spaces and accessible routes to all resort facilities.

Special Needs Units

Two one-bedroom, one-bathroom (group code 51) Two two-bedroom, two-bathroom (group code 52)

All special needs units have card key locks, lever door handles, level thresholds and 33" entry clearance. All interior doorways have at least 33" of clearance. All special needs unit bathrooms are equipped with grab bars, 17" high toilets, at least 27" of knee clearance under lavatories and tub/showers with grab bars, hand-held showerheads and shower curtains. Portable bath benches with back support are also available. One two-bedroom unit has a 30"x58" roll-in shower; however, there is a 2½" threshold that makes backing out of the shower in a wheelchair difficult. Bedrooms have at least 36" of clearance on one bed side. Kitchens have front-control appliances, 34" sinks, a section of counter at 34" and microwaves at 48". Dining room tables have 28" of knee clearance. Living rooms are a little crowded, but the large decks have at least 32" access through the doorway and only 1" thresholds.

Though all of the standard units have 32" clearance on entries and interior door widths of at least 31", the standard one-bedroom unit represents the most accessible alternative to a special needs unit because it has a floor plan similar to a special needs one-bedroom unit and has a bathroom large enough to accommodate most wheelchairs.
