Things to See and Do at Lake of the Ozarks

The Ozark Plateau extends from southern Missouri to northern Arkansas and lays nestled between rivers of the same names. At the northern end of the plateau spreads the massive **Lake of the Ozarks**—a many-fingered, 90-mile manmade lake with more than 1,150 miles of meandering shoreline. With its expansive forests, verdant hills, dramatic bluffs and fabulous water activities, Lake of the Ozarks has become a premier vacation spot; a perfect retreat for water-skiing, speed boating, jet skiing, fishing, swimming, parasailing and pretty much any other watersport you can think up. But the lake is just the beginning for area fun.

Just outside **Osage Beach** is **Big Surf Water Park**, with thrilling trips down whitewater rapids and flumes, plus laid-back floating on the lazy river ride. And don't forget **golfing**; there are 225 holes of championship golf and seven miniature golf courses waiting for you here.

The lush hills that once concealed moonshiners and counterfeiters are

now home to **Ha Ha Tonka State Park**, featuring uncompromised natural splendor (with a rather odd name). Geologically, Ha Ha Tonka is classified as “karst” topography, meaning landscape characterized by sinkholes, caves, underground streams, large springs and natural bridges. And while the bluffs, gorges and savanna prairies are among the nation's most impressive, what makes this park really stand out is the haunting, burnt-out stone shell of a turn-of-the-century castle. Not to be outdone, though, there's also the 17,300-acre **Ozarks State Park**, with wildlife ranging from the great blue heron to waterfowl, and white tail deer to chipmunks.

Missouri earns its name as the cave state with more than 5,380 registered and mapped wild caves. Local cave tours like **Jacob's Cave** or **Bridal Cave** are both fascinating and educational.

Several merging rivers, including the Osage, Glaize and Niangua feed Lake Ozark. Due to this layout, the towns scattered all around it are never more than a stone's throw away from each

other—and each is marked by its own flavor and character.

Take, for example, **Versailles** or **Laurie**, prime stop-offs on the community antique-shopping circuit (which boasts more than 50 antique stores), or the scenic highlights of the self-guided backroads Ozark tour. Of course, there's the town of **Lake Ozark**, a somewhat “rough-and-tumble” waterfront town. Its main street is defined by old-time, low-rise storefronts with wooden awnings showcasing tattoo parlors, **Richard's Relic Shack**, the **Rock Island Line Saloon** and **Mark Twain paddle/riverboat tours**.

No matter what you end up doing, even if it's simply escaping the oppressive heat by plunging into the murky cold river, the Ozarks will charm you. From watching fidgety dragonflies skitter the water's surface to treating yourself to frozen custard, this region is full of down-home fun.

Driving Directions

From Kansas City, MO:

- Take I-70 or Hwy 50 East to Hwy 65 South
- Take Hwy 65 South to Hwy 54 East to Osage Beach.
- **You will follow Hwy 54 to Lake Rd 54-29, which is also marked as Passover Rd. across the street from Shoney's**
- Continue 2 miles on 54-29 until you reach the entrance to WorldMark Lake of the Ozarks at the end of the road.

From St. Louis, MO:

- Take I-70 West to Hwy 54 West in Kingdom City.
- Follow Hwy 54 to Osage Beach
- Follow the directions in **bold** above.

From Springfield, MO:

- Take I-44 East to the second Lebanon exit (Hwy 5/Hwy32).
- At the top of the exit ramp, turn left.
- Follow Hwy 5 to Camdenton where you will turn East on Hwy 54 to Osage Beach.
- Follow the directions in **bold** to the left.
