## Things to See and Do in Pinetop-Lakeside

**C** urrounded by the White Mountains, the Pinetop-Lakeside area is a playground for outdoor enthusiasts. Welcome to "Trail Town, U.S.A.," home of the White Mountain Trail System. Nearly 180 miles of trails have been carefully designed, showcasing the area's beauty while preserving the land, vegetation and wildlife. With numerous rugged loops as well as wheelchair-accessible stretches, everyone can find a path to wander here. For a leisurely walk, try the Mogollon Rim Nature Trail; for a more challenging one, seek out the Salthouse #18 Trailhead. The White Mountain Trail System is also open to equestrians, mountain bikers and cross-country skiers. Keep an eye out for elk, bald eagles, pronghorn antelope, coyotes, bear, fox, bighorn sheep and bobcats-all residents of Arizona's high country.

With an elevation of 7,200 feet and the largest stand of ponderosa pines in North America, Pinetop is aptly named. Not only is the mountain air cool, it's also thin, allowing golfers to make the longest drives of their careers. Six public golf courses in the area provide diverse golf experiences for enthusiasts of all abilities.

Fifty lakes and 500 miles of streams garnish the White Mountains for your fishing pleasure. Fishing has a big following in the White Mountains,

since anglers can reel in four kinds of trout, blue gill, bass, Arctic Grayling, green sunfish, walleye and catfish. Licenses are required for anglers 14 years and older. The surrounding area is known worldwide for its prime trophy elk and bear, and hunters from all over come to try their skills.

A four-season destination means snow activities, too. Many favorites can be found just 30 minutes away at Sunrise Park Resort, which features 65 trails and eight chairlifts spread out over three mountains. It also has crosscountry skiing and snowmobiling trails, while being located near fine sledding areas. The season stretches from early December to early April.

The White Mountains are dotted with historical sites, all within easy driving distance of the resort. The Kinishba Ruins, containing more than 200 rooms, are more than 1,000 years old. At Lyman Lake State Park, hike a one-mile trail lined with petroglyphs. Anasazi Indians from 300 B.C. have been credited as the artists. Visit Casa Malpais-House of the Badlands—Archaeological Park. Here you can examine 800-year-old traces of a Mogollon pueblo, including a hidden staircase to the clifftop, large kiva, tether rock, ceremonial plaza, petroglyphs and underground fissures. The White Mountain Archaeology Center gives you the

unique opportunity to try your hand at excavating ruins. To explore a site of more recent history, stop at Fort Apache, which was home to the 1<sup>st</sup> and 21st Infantry during the time of Geronimo and Cochise.

The White Mountains are also home to a number of extraordinary natural landmarks, including the Apache-Sitgreaves National Forests, whose elevations range from 3,500 to 11,000 feet across two million acres. Investigate the world's largest concentration of petrified wood at the Petrified Forest National Park. This 300-square-mile park also includes sections of the Painted Desert, with clay formations sculpted by wind and an ancient sea. Visit the "mini-Grand Canyon," the Salt River Canyon. This beautiful landmark is a two-hour drive southwest of Pinetop-Lakeside, where lofty mesas, multi-colored buttes, spires and rock walls adorn the canyon. The highway descends 2,000 feet to the floor of the canyon via a series of switchbacks.

Throughout the year, the Pinetop-Lakeside Chamber of Commerce hosts special events ranging from Native American arts festivals and bluegrass concerts to bake sales and mountain bike tours. For further information, visit www.wmonline.com or call the Chamber of Commerce at (520) 367-4290.

### **Driving Directions**

#### From Phoenix, AZ

- Take I-10 East to Hwy 60.
- Go northeast on Hwy 60 to Show Low.
- The highway splits here; turn right, or southeast, along Hwy 260.
- Continue driving southeast on Hwy 260 through Pinetop-Lakeside. You will pass three Circle K Markets, one on your left, then two on your right (the last is 3/10 mile away).
- Turn left onto South WorldMark Drive. If you reach the Hon Dah Casino, you have gone 3 miles too far.

#### From Flagstaff, AZ

- Take I-40 East to Holbrook.
- Go south on Hwy 77 to Show Low.
- Turn right into town and then left onto Highway 260, heading toward Pinetop-Lakeside.
- Follow the **bold** directions above.
