Special Needs Unit Features

- All entry doors have 33" of clearance and card key locks
- Entry doors have lever handles; interior doors have knobs
- Interior doorways have 31" access
- Portable visual alarms for fire, door, and phone
- Roll-under lavatory with 25½" knee clearance
- Handheld showerheads
- Portable bath benches
- Bed heights about 24"
- 15" high toilets
- Grab bars
- Minimum of 36" access to at least one bed side
- Dining room table has 28" knee clearance
- Front control stove/oven
- 36" access to patio
- Compliance kit with TDD unit and visual alarms for fire, phone and doorbell available

Resort Accessible Features

- Accessible parking
- Accessible routes to all resort facilities

WorldMark Leavenworth is located on level to gently sloping property, with accessible routes to all resort facilities and ground floor units. The resort has accessible parking.

Special Needs Units

Two-bedroom, two-bathroom

All special needs units have card key lock entry, lever entry door handle, flush thresholds and 33" entry clearance. All interior doors have knobs and 31" of clearance. All special needs bathrooms are equipped with grab bars, 15" high toilets, roll-under lavatories with 25½" knee clearance and standard 15" tub/showers with curtains, portable bath benches with back support and handheld showerheads. Bedrooms have at least 36" clearance on at least one bed side. Kitchens have front control oven/stoves and 36" counters. Dining room tables have 28" of knee clearance and living rooms are spacious. 6'x 8' decks have 36" access and 1" thresholds.

All units at this property are two-bedroom, and any of the ground floor standard units might work for mobility impaired guests because the floor plans and door widths are comparable to the special needs units.
