

Special Needs Unit Features

- Card key lock entry
- All doors have at least 32" of clearance

WorldMark at Victoria features accessible garage parking, automatic lobby doors, a lowered section at the check-in counter, elevators, accessible routes to all resort facilities and a lift for the outdoor pool and spa. The surrounding property is level to gently sloping. Victoria itself is very accessible with much pedestrian traffic around the historic harbor area, which boasts numerous attractions, shops and restaurants. The resort has one TDD unit available. The special needs two-bedroom penthouse is equipped with visual fire alarms.

Special Needs Units

Two-bedroom, two-bathroom penthouse

All special needs units feature card key lock entry, lever door handles and level thresholds. All doorways have at least 32" of clearance. Bathrooms are equipped with 18" toilets, 27" of knee clearance under lavatory, grab bars and 20" high tub/showers with hand held showers and grab bars. A portable bath bench with back support is also available. Bedrooms are compact, but offer good access on one bed side. The kitchens have sinks with 27" of knee clearance and front control appliances. Living rooms are compact and dining tables offer 26" of knee clearance.

Most WorldMark units at Victoria are two-bedroom configurations, but the most accessible of the standard rooms is the two-bedroom queens, which have 27" door widths, slightly larger rooms and a bathroom large enough to accommodate most wheelchairs.
